Number of credits, cumulative GPA, GPA in concentration area, must meet program requirements, and no level 3 or 4 behaviors.

Pathway Endorsements Silver, Gold, Renaissance



How do I graduate with honors or endorsements?

- Counselors will determine who has met requirements
- We'll publish a list in April
- Appeals process if you aren't on the list

What is a Capstone?



- A capstone is more than a project
- Showcases math, language arts,
 postsecondary and workforce readiness
 skills, & proficiency in the SELF traits
- Demonstrates new learning and growth
- 10 hours of documented fieldwork
- Includes a pre-search paper, an oral presentation, and portfolio

Capstone Process



- Advisory sessions with specific tasks and due dates - every other Friday
 - Students are given time to work and complete tasks and ask questions – attendance is imperative
 - Work sessions if they do not attend
- All seniors will take a quarter long capstone class 1st semester
 - Finish work
 - Prepare for presentation
 - Opt Out Option Available for those who are on track, demonstrates agency, parent approval, administrator/counselor approval
- Students should work with advisors to schedule their presentations now

- Presentation to Advisor, Mentor, and at least one additional evaluator
- Rubric used to grade Capstone
 - 1 = Developing, 2 = Proficient, 3 = Advanced
- A proficient score is a graduation requirement.
- Developing requires remediation.
- Advanced score qualifies for competitive entry for scholarship.

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1st Place = $4,000
2nd Place = $2,000
3rd Place = $1,000
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- Earn a 0.5 elective credit (P/F)
- Rubric can be found on CCHS website

Capstone Presentation



12-20 minute presentation

Presentation to a panel - Advisor, Mentor, and at least one additional evaluator

Must include KNOWLEDGE (both ELA and Mathematics), plus two other SELF traits selected by the student.

Students must be prepared to answer questions about all seven traits.

<u>Template</u> provided to support the process

What do I need to know about College Applications?

Application deadlines:

- Early Decision around Nov, binding, decision by Dec
- Early Action around Nov, non-binding, decision by Dec
- Regular Decision non-binding, widely available
- Most deadlines range from Nov 1 to summer after senior year

Have a resume up to date and ready - referencing it will make filling out applications much easier






How to Request Transcripts in Naviance


If using Common App, you must complete the FERPA waiver on the Common App and match your accounts by providing your email address

Letters of Recommendation



- Recommendation letters can be instrumental in your admission to a university and your scholarship opportunities
- Choose teachers/coaches/administrators/ counselors/community adults who know you well and can discuss your AWESOME QUALITIES
- Always ask (in person if possible) before you send a request and give them as much notice as possible
- Most will want a resumé or information sheet to help them as they write the letter

Scholarship Tips



- Sign up for websites like RaiseMe, Going Merry
- Apply for everything! But don't pay for scholarships
- Check requirements and watch deadlines
- Don't count out scholarships with lower amounts
- Don't become discouraged if don't get one right away
- Check the college website (See list and links on CCHS Counseling Scholarship website) Many colleges will automatically consider students for Merit Scholarships based on your application to the college.
