

We are beginning the scheduling process for next year. Counselors will work with your students to develop plans based on their Individual Career and Academic Plan (ICAP) principle. From the CDE website, an ICAP is:

A multi-year ICAP process intentionally guides students and families in the exploration of career, academic, and postsecondary opportunities. With the support of adults, students develop the awareness, knowledge, attitudes, and skills to create meaningful and powerful pathways to be career and college-ready. Life beyond high school is different than what it used to be. Three out of four jobs in Colorado will require education or training beyond high school. There are fewer jobs for high school graduates now than at any other time in Colorado's history, including the need for in-demand Postsecondary and Workforce Ready (PWR) skills that meet business, industry, and higher education standards. ICAP gives students ownership of a process that helps them explore their unique talents and aspirations, participate in career and postsecondary options, and create pathways to financial success after high school.

At CCHS, we offer more career and college-ready programs than almost any school in Colorado. Our <u>Pathways Handbook</u> is newly arranged to help you and your student figure out what career they wish to pursue and how best to meet the training and education to apply for that career straight from our graduation stage. 

We often have parents and students who want to know how many college credits have been earned, what it would take to earn an associate degree, and how to request a transcript from PCC. Students can find this information in their

Pueblo Community College portal. Most students, however, have never logged into their portal. Here are some instructions on accessing

students use their 9 direct Go to <u>pueblocc.edu</u>. Click "login" and then click "need help with your login?" At that point, click "I forgot my password" and then choose to reset it with either identity verification or by email/text. If you choose identity verification, you will need to answer questions regarding demographics. The password has to meet certain requirements including being at least 14 characters long so I suggest students use their 8-digit school password plus their 6-digit birthdate (but they can use any password they want). Once they create the password, they can then login at any time to see their courses, run a degree check if they want to earn an associate degree, print an unofficial transcript and/or send an official transcript.

We highly encourage all students who are taking concurrent enrollment courses to become familiar with their PCC college portal. This will help them access information and services (including scholarship applications) through PCC and will also allow them practice for what a four-year college portal may look like.


